Claimants diagnosed with pleural plaques indicating exposure to asbestos — Whether aggregate of presence of plaques, risk of developing serious illness and resulting anxiety giving rise to claim against employer — Whether employer liable for psychiatric injury caused by fear of contracting asbestos-related disease
